

Earn college credit for your EF Gap experience

Enhance your EF gap experience by enrolling in one of the following course programs offered through our innovative educational partner, Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU). You can earn a university-level certificate for your Gap Year, or semester credit hours for select Gap Year or Gap Semester program modules. Begin building a professional resume and gain confidence about how to approach the university experience ahead by completing advanced coursework, refining your academic goals, and honing your career skills. Students who attend these courses routinely find they have a better understanding of what the professional world values, are more prepared for college success, and are better positioned to take on community, campus, or business leadership roles.

EF GLOBAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

EF Gap Year students are eligible to earn 18 semester hours of credit for their 26-week program. A SNHU professor and EF Academic Mentors guide participants through a student-designed course program that focuses on global citizenship, college success, and the building blocks of an international career. Students will interpret their own, personal gap experiences in the broader context of a multicultural world, achieve outcomes that prepare them for success in college and the career world, and complete a culminating project that makes an authentic contribution to the global conversation. On successful completion of the program, students can request a letter of recommendation from their professor. They can even be considered for preferred admission to a degree program at SNHU.

INDIVIDUAL COURSES

EF Gap Year and Gap Semester students can also take select individual courses for credit at SNHU to correspond with an appropriate Gap Year or Gap Semester program module. Through the guidance of an SNHU Professor and EF Academic Mentors, students translate their hands-on experience, unique research activity, and continuous self-reflection into usable, resume-building outcomes such as cultural literacy, language fluency, community action, business knowledge, and leadership skills.

HOW TO ENROLL

As soon as you are fully enrolled on your EF Gap program, you can speak with an EF Gap Advisor about which courses make the most sense for you. You will then be guided step-by-step through the easy registration process prior to your departure. At the successful completion of your course, all credits will be awarded by Southern New Hampshire University. FINANCIAL AID OPTIONS

You may be able to use funds in your 529 savings plan to pay for expenses associated with your EF Gap experience. But be sure to check with your financial advisor beforehand, as rules vary by state. Only students who are enrolled in a full-time degree program at SNHU and taking courses recognized as degree requirements may be eligible to use Pell Grants or subsidized or unsubsidized federal loans.
